Cross-Cutting Theme 1: Sex and Gender Topics Include:

- Differences across the lifespan, including for older women
- Differences in sexuality



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Cross-Cutting Objectives/Recommendations



Cross-Cutting Theme 2: Equity and Disparities Topics Include:

- Racial/ethnic, geographic, and socioeconomic disparities (also overlap with sex/gender)
- Disability as a disparity group and intersectionality with race, etc.
- Culturally competent/sensitive interventions and services
- Disparities in age of diagnosis and access to services and supports
- Balanced and representative research samples
- Representation in the workforce
- Inclusion, accessibility, accommodations, universal design

COVID-19



- COVID-19 and Physical Health
 - Heightened risk of COVID-19 in the autism community
 - Impact of COVID-19 on maternal health and pre- and post-natal development
- Impact of COVID-19 Mitigation Efforts
 - Vaccination distribution and uptake
 - Sensory and communication issues associated with prevention, intervention
 - Services disruptions and mental health impacts of physical distancing
- Impact of COVID-19 Pandemic on Autism Research
- What have we learned? How can we better prepare for the future?



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Summary of Discussions



- The IACC Strategic Plan is an advisory document required by Congress to provide advice to the HHS Secretary on autism-related efforts and activities.
- The 2021-2022 IACC Strategic Plan for Autism Research, Services, and Policy consists of 7 community-based Questions and two Cross-Cutting Themes.
- The IACC was given an overview of the first draft of the *Strategic Plan* drafted by OARC and provided input on the topics covered in the plan.

IACC Strategic Plan Next Steps



- OARC will incorporate IACC feedback collected today into the draft IACC Strategic Plan.
- IACC members will receive a survey and can continue sending additional feedback to OARC over the summer.
- OARC will present a second draft of the IACC Strategic Plan to the IACC in October.
- The IACC will discuss and potentially vote to approve the IACC Strategic Plan at the October 26th full IACC Committee Meeting.
- OARC will incorporate any additional feedback and prepare the approved IACC Strategic Plan for publication.
